ADMISSION

To ensure consideration an application should be submitted by March 1 for the fall semester and October 1 for the spring semester. An application will be reviewed after the deadlines on a space available basis.

To make your application competitive for admission you will need grades of "A" or "B" in high school and college level science and math classes; at least a 3.0 GPA in high school and college; and SAT or ACT scores that exceed our minimum suggested scores of: SAT (480 critical writing/440 math) or ACT(19).

The following courses are required for admission: Completion of Algebra I, Algebra II, either geometry or a math with Algebra II as a prerequisite, chemistry and biology at the high school level or higher. To enroll in the program you must provide evidence of completion of a nursing assistant course within the past year or be on the current North Carolina NA I registry.

Can I transfer credit?
