

## PRE-NURSING TRACK

The Pre-Nursing Track consists of 28 semester hours of credit that can be completed over two semesters. Students enrolled in the Pre-Nursing Track will be accepted into the ADN program at Cabarrus College at the end of the second semester of the Pre-Nursing Track if the following criteria have been met:

1. All courses in the Pre-Nursing Track have been completed by prior transfer credit for applicable courses (see criteria 2) or by completion at Cabarrus College.
2. A grade of "B" or higher is earned in the following courses at Cabarrus College (transfer credit is not accepted): BIO 100, BIO 210, and BIO 220 (see the Cabarrus College course catalog on the College website for the full course description).
3. A cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher achieved for all courses taken at Cabarrus College.
4. Successful completion of a Nursing Aide I certification program or listing on the NC NAI Registry.
5. Successful completion of American Heart Association Healthcare Provider CPR.

## ADMISSION

To ensure consideration an application should be submitted by March 1 for the fall semester and October 1 for the spring semester. An application will be reviewed after the deadlines on a space available basis.

Applicants are considered based on academic history, standardized test scores, class rank, references and essay. Admission to the Associate in Science Degree (all tracks) requires completion of Algebra I, Algebra II, either geometry or a math with Algebra II as a prerequisite, chemistry and biology at the high school level or higher. The Pre-Professional and Life Sciences Tracks have suggested minimum scores on the SAT (430 critical reading/380 math), ACT (18) or ASSET (35 writing, 37 reading, 33 numerical). The Pre-Nursing Track has suggested minimum scores on the SAT (480 critical reading/440 math), or ACT (19).
