

## BSHSLM INFORMATION

The Health Services Leadership & Management (BSHSLM) curriculum is designed to meet the needs of adult learners. A primary focus of the program is to offer flexibility and convenience to assist you in meeting your educational goals. Courses are offered in a variety of formats (face-to-face, web enhanced, and web based). Courses are offered in the evenings Monday through Thursdays, and on some weekends.

Once a student has completed HSL 300 (Introduction to Health Services Organizations) and MAT 310 (Statistics) they can enroll in any of the program courses. Each student determines their appropriate course load. Students attending full time (enrolling in four classes a semester) typically graduate in two years. Students enrolling in two classes each semester typically graduate in 4 years.

## ADMISSION

To ensure consideration an application should be submitted by March 1 for the fall semester and October 1 for the spring semester. An application will be reviewed after the deadlines on a space available basis.

Applicants to the BSHSLM program should successfully complete an associate degree in a healthcare related discipline with a minimum grade point average of 2.5 recommended. Completion of an associate degree in an area other than healthcare will be considered when individuals have work experience in healthcare.

Applicants must complete high school or college level Algebra I, Algebra II, geometry, and a math with Algebra II as a prerequisite. Completion of a written essay and two letters of reference are also required.

### Can I transfer credit?

Yes. Up to 60 hours of coursework can be transferred from your associate degree program to the BSHSLM degree. Coursework in addition to that used in awarding your associate degree will be reviewed on a course by course basis. Some limitations may apply to the transfer of certain biological and physical science courses, as well as technology courses. Once you have been admitted to a degree program the registrar will determine transferability of credit and develop a curriculum plan.

### How do I apply for financial aid?
